




ART & ARCHITECTURE IN SICILY

ITINERARY & DATES



Over nine days, from the 5th to the 14th of September 2026, we will journey across Sicily, immersing ourselves in three millennia of history.

We begin in Palermo, Sicily's vibrant capital, a cultural mosaic where Arab, Norman, and Baroque influences coexist in striking harmony.

From there, we travel to a small village within the Madonie National Park, our base for exploring the Valley of the Temples and discovering hidden treasures and authentic Sicilian traditions.

Our journey continues northeast to a beautiful historic villa by the sea, which will serve as our base for visiting Taormina, Sicily's most glamorous hilltop town, and the superb collections of the Regional Museum of Messina, home to two of Caravaggio's final masterpieces. We will also cross the Strait of Messina to admire the extraordinary Riace Bronzes.

We conclude in Ortigia (Syracuse), a UNESCO World Heritage site celebrated for its refined architecture, shimmering sea views, and timeless atmosphere.




5 SEPTEMBER - WELCOME TO SICILY

Overnight in Palermo

A private transfer will greet you at Palermo Airport and accompany you to Hotel Palazzo Sovrana. At 5:00 p.m., we will gather on the hotel's rooftop restaurant for welcome drinks and introductions, enjoying our first views of the city. Later, we will take a leisurely stroll through Palermo's vibrant streets before concluding the evening with a welcome dinner in a traditional trattoria.





6 SEPTEMBER - ART, ARCHITECTURE AND TRADITIONS IN PALERMO

Overnight in Palermo

We begin the day with a guided visit to Palazzo Abatellis, a 15th-century palace that houses one of Sicily's most refined art collections. From here, we stroll to the vintage market in Piazza Marina, a lively treasure trove where you may find antique prints, ceramics, handmade jewelry, and beautifully worn Sicilian curiosities. We then continue to the Oratorio di San Lorenzo, a jewel box adorned with Giacomo Serpotta's stunning stuccoes. In the afternoon, we visit the Convent of Santa Caterina



wandering through its peaceful cloister and tasting the convent's famed handmade biscuits, followed by a guided visit of Palermo's majestic Cathedral. The evening is at leisure, with an independent dinner.



7 SEPTEMBER - FROM ARAB NORMAN ART TO MEDIEVAL VILLAGES

Overnight in Polizzi Generosa

We check out from the hotel and head to Monreale Cathedral, a UNESCO World Heritage Site renowned for its dazzling Arab-Norman mosaics, one of the greatest masterpieces of medieval art and architecture. After a light lunch, we continue into the Madonie Mountains and settle into our next accommodation in Polizzi Generosa. In the evening, we will take a relaxed stroll through the village's picturesque streets before enjoying dinner in a traditional trattoria.





8 SEPTEMBER - THE VALLEY OF THE TEMPLES

Overnight in Polizzi Genrosa

Today we explore the Valley of the Temples, one of the world's most iconic archaeological sites. Led by an expert archaeologist, we explore the fascinating history of Greek Sicily. After a light lunch, we visit the Archaeological Museum, home to an exceptional collection of artifacts from ancient Akragas, including one of the colossal Telamons that once supported the Temple of Zeus. On our return to Polizzi, we will gather for a relaxed dinner at home.





9 SEPTEMBER - MEETING THE COMMUNITY

Overnight in Polizzi Generosa



Today we visit Giovanni d'Angelo, a seventh-generation ceramist, to learn about the art of pottery making and the traditions of Sicilian maiolica. We will also have the opportunity to paint our own tile, creating a personalised piece of Sicilian craftsmanship, to take home.



In the afternoon, we visit Verbumcaudo, a cooperative of young locals who cultivate land confiscated from the Mafia. Committed to sustainable agriculture and community development, they produce high-quality local goods while promoting social justice and revitalisation in the area. We will learn about their mission, taste their products, and discover how their work is transforming once-tainted land into a source of pride for the community. The remainder of the day is at leisure, with an independent dinner.





10 SEPTEMBER - ANCIENT ROMAN MOSAICS UNVEIL FASCINATING STORIES - Overnight at Villa Pulejo (Messina)



Today we journey northeast to discover more of Sicily's rich heritage. On our way to Messina, we stop at Villa Romana del Casale, a World Heritage Site renowned for its 3,500 square meters of remarkably preserved Roman mosaics. An expert archaeologist will reveal the captivating stories and symbolism woven into these extraordinary works. From there, we continue to Messina, where our next accommodation awaits.





11 SEPTEMBER - CARAVAGGIO'S FINAL MASTERPIECES & RIACE BRONZES - Overnight at Villa Pulejo (Messina)

Today we enjoy a later start, with time to relax by the villa's garden pool and spa. In the afternoon, we visit the Regional Museum of Messina, home to a remarkable collection of artworks, including two of Caravaggio's final masterpieces. Afterwards, we cross the Strait of Messina to Reggio Calabria to admire the magnificent Riace Bronzes, two full-size Greek warriors dating to around 460-450 BC, considered among the greatest masterpieces of ancient sculpture. We return to the villa after dinner.






12 SEPTEMBER - FROM TAORMINA TO ORTIGIA

Overnight in Ortigia (Siracusa)

Today we head southeast toward Siracusa. Along the way, we stop in Taormina, a picturesque town overlooking the Mediterranean Sea and Mount Etna. With our expert guide, we will visit the Ancient Theatre, an extraordinary blend of Greek and Roman design. After a light lunch in a peaceful garden courtyard, away from the busy streets, we continue to the little island of Ortigia, just off Siracusa, to immerse ourselves in the charm of Sicilian Baroque.






13 SEPTEMBER - EXPLORING SIRACUSA'S ART AND ARCHITECTURE

Overnight in Ortigia (Siracusa)

This morning we visit the Gallery of Palazzo Bellomo, which houses a remarkable collection of art from the 15th through the 18th century. After our visit, you will enjoy some free time in Ortigia. We will regroup after lunch to explore the Duomo and uncover its remarkable history. Afterwards, we head to the Santuario di Santa Lucia al Sepolcro, just outside Ortigia, to view Caravaggio's masterpiece *The Burial of Saint Lucy* in situ. In the evening, we gather for a farewell dinner.






14 SEPTEMBER - OPTIONAL EXTENSION OR DEPARTURE

On this day, you may choose to extend your stay in Sicily, perhaps exploring the Baroque towns of the Val di Noto, visiting Catania and Mount Etna, or enjoying a few days in nearby Malta, which is easily accessible from Sicily.

Alternatively, private transport will be arranged for your departure to either Catania Airport.

Hotel Palazzo Sovrana - Palermo (2 Nights)

Palazzo Sovrana is a beautifully restored historic residence offering elegant suites and refined hospitality in the heart of Palermo. With views of the grand Teatro Massimo and walking access to the city's most important landmarks, it seamlessly blends historic charm with contemporary design.



The Sicilian House - Polizzi Generosa (3 Nights)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What time do daily activities start?

Daily activities generally begin around 10:00 a.m., allowing for a relaxed morning and an unhurried breakfast.

What level of fitness is required?

This tour requires a moderate level of fitness. Some days include approximately three to four hours of relaxed walking or standing, often during guided visits in museums, archaeological sites, and historic centres. However, the pace is unhurried, with frequent breaks and ample time to rest.

Can I skip some of the scheduled activities for more free time?

Yes, the tour is designed to offer flexibility, so you can opt in and out of certain activities.

Which flights should I book to and from Sicily for this tour?

We recommend arriving in Palermo between 12:00 and 2:00 p.m. on September 5th, as check-in at the accommodation is available after 2:30 p.m. Unless you plan to extend your stay, we suggest scheduling your departure from Catania Airport on September 14th. Please keep in mind that the transfer from Siracusa to Catania Airport takes approximately one hour, so we advise avoiding very early morning flights. These guidelines are intended to ensure smooth and comfortable transitions in line with hotel check-in and check-out times; however, guests are welcome to select alternative arrival or departure times if they prefer.

Can I do this tour on dates other than the scheduled ones?

What will the weather be like in September in Sicily?

September in Sicily is generally mild and pleasant, with daytime temperatures ranging from 24°C to 28°C and many bright, sunny days. Occasional light showers are possible, and temperatures can vary between coastal and inland areas. In the mountain regions, such as the Madonie, it can be noticeably cooler, especially in the mornings and evenings. We recommend packing layers and versatile clothing suitable for both warm and cooler moments.

What's Included

The tour includes nine nights of accommodation in historic Sicilian palazzi or villas, with the option to upgrade room category upon request and subject to availability. The journey is fully escorted and includes daily breakfast, three dinners, welcome drinks and aperitivo on arrival, a tasting of local products. All admissions to sites and museums mentioned in the itinerary are included, along with professionally guided visits led by expert scholars, private transportation throughout, and the ferry service to and from Reggio Calabria. The program also provides a private airport pickup upon arrival in Palermo and a group transfer to Catania Airport on September 14th, departing at 10:00 a.m. and arriving at approximately 11:00 a.m.

City taxes, as well as full assistance before, during, and after the tour, are also included.

What's Not Included

The tour price does not include international or domestic flights, travel insurance, personal expenses, additional meals or beverages not specified in the itinerary.

Payments

A 30% deposit is required to confirm your booking. Final payment is due no later than 90 days before the tour commences.

Cancellation Policy

We strongly recommend purchasing "Cancel for Any Reason" insurance to protect against unforeseen changes to your plans. Otherwise, please refer to our cancellation terms below:

- More than 90 days before the tour commences: Your deposit will be credited toward another tour departing within 12 months of the original tour date.
- Between 90 and 30 days before the tour commences: 40% of the full amount will be reimbursed, 40% of the full amount credited toward another tour departing within 12 months.
- Less than 30 days before the tour commences: Full charges will apply.
